Mesolithic talk

Oughterard Courthouse was packed last Friday to listen to Bill Daly giving an interesting and entertaining presentation on the first people to settle in Oughterard, almost 7,000 years ago.

Evidence of this Mesolithic, or Middle Stone Age, settlement is provided by small stone tools which were found at River Island, where the Owenriff meets Lough Corrib.

Physical reconstructions of a Mesolithic house, tools, weapons and artefacts were also on display at the presentation, and much of the audience enjoyed taking hands-on advantage of this. What a wonderful celebration of our first residents, proving once again that we all came from somewhere else!

Bill Daly plans to continue developing this project, including involvement of local schools in a Mesolithic Village, and a further presentation at the Courthouse in September.
