The Civil Service Commissioners will conduct, under Section 29 (1) of the Civil Service Commissioners Act, 1956, qualifying educational examinations of candidates for appointment and enrolment as members of the

GARDA SÍOCHÁNA.

The Commissioners, with the consent of the Minister for Finance, have made the following Regulations, under Section 29 (2) of the Civil Service Commissioners Act, 1956, in relation to every such examination which may be held from 1st January, 1959, until further notice.

REGULATIONS.

1. Each qualifying educational examination shall consist of the following tests (detailed Syllabus is printed overleaf):

(a) A written examination in the following subjects:

	<i>Maximum Marks</i>
Gaeilge	300
English	300
Arithmetic (in Irish or English) ..	300
Geography (in Irish or English) ..	150

(b) A test in Oral Irish.

2. To pass the qualifying educational examination candidates must qualify in the written examination by gaining at least 100 marks for each of the subjects Gaeilge, English and Arithmetic *and* at least 50 marks for Geography *and* an aggregate of at least 525 marks for all four subjects combined; and qualify in the test in Oral Irish reaching such a standard therein as the Commissioners consider satisfactory.

3. Each candidate must pay a fee of 12s. 6d. for admission to the qualifying educational examination, by affixing State Service Stamps to the form of authorisation to attend the written examination.

4. The Commissioners will not be responsible for any expense incurred by candidates.

SYLLABUS

(a) *Written Examination.*

GAEILGE (300 marks):

(i) To write a letter, essay or dialogue (about one foolscap page in length) on a simple prescribed subject. (150 marks.)

(ii) Written translation from Irish to English and from English to Irish, on ordinary topics such as: salutations, food and drink, clothes, health and sickness, weather, games and pastimes. (150 marks.)

ENGLISH (300 marks):

(i) To write a letter, essay or dialogue (about two foolscap pages in length) on a prescribed subject. (250 marks.)

(ii) *Handwriting*: Candidates will be required to copy out a passage in English. *There will not be any errors for correction, as the paper is a test in handwriting only.* No special style of handwriting is required, but legibility, neatness and a sufficient speed are important.

(50 marks.)

ARITHMETIC, in Irish or English (300 marks):

Long tots and cross tots. The first four rules; vulgar fractions and decimal fractions (not including recurring decimals); simple proportion based on whole numbers.

GEOGRAPHY, in Irish or English (150 marks):

A general knowledge of the geography of Ireland: the names and positions of:—the counties and county towns, the chief centres of population, the principal seaports, the principal railway centres, the chief seats of industry, the mountain ranges and the large rivers.

(b) *Test in Oral Irish.*

Simple conversation on ordinary topics such as: salutations, food and drink, clothes, health and sickness, weather, games and pastimes.
