*Samuel Shone of Galway and John Mahon of Rinncinn? In the County of Galway, Commissioners only appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth, entitled an act to provide for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilcummin in the County of Galway. Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever, within the said Parish is One Hundred and forty pounds Sterling of which sum of one hundred and forty pounds, the sum of seventy pounds sterling is due and payable to Richard Martin, esquire, of Clareville in the County of Galway and his successors as Lay impropiator of the tithes of one half of said Parish. and the sum of Thirty Five Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the very Reverend James Daly Warden of Galway and his successors, and the sum of Thirty Five Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Reverend John Wilson and his successors as possessor of the Vicarial or Bishops Quarter tithes of said Parish.*

*And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the corn principally grown in such county for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and twenty one, is ten shillings and six pence by the Barrell.*

and his Successors as Lay impropriator of the tithes of one  
half of said Barons, and the sum of Thirty five pounds Sterling  
is due and payable to the very Reverend James Daly Warden  
of Galway and his Successors, and the sum of Thirty five pounds  
Sterling is due and payable to the Reverend John Wilson and  
his Successors, as possessor of the vicarial or Bishop's Quarter tithes  
of said Barons.

And We do further certify that the average price of Oats  
being the corn principally grown in such County for  
the period of seven Years ending on the first day of  
November One thousand eight hundred and twenty one  
is ten shillings and six pence by the Barons
