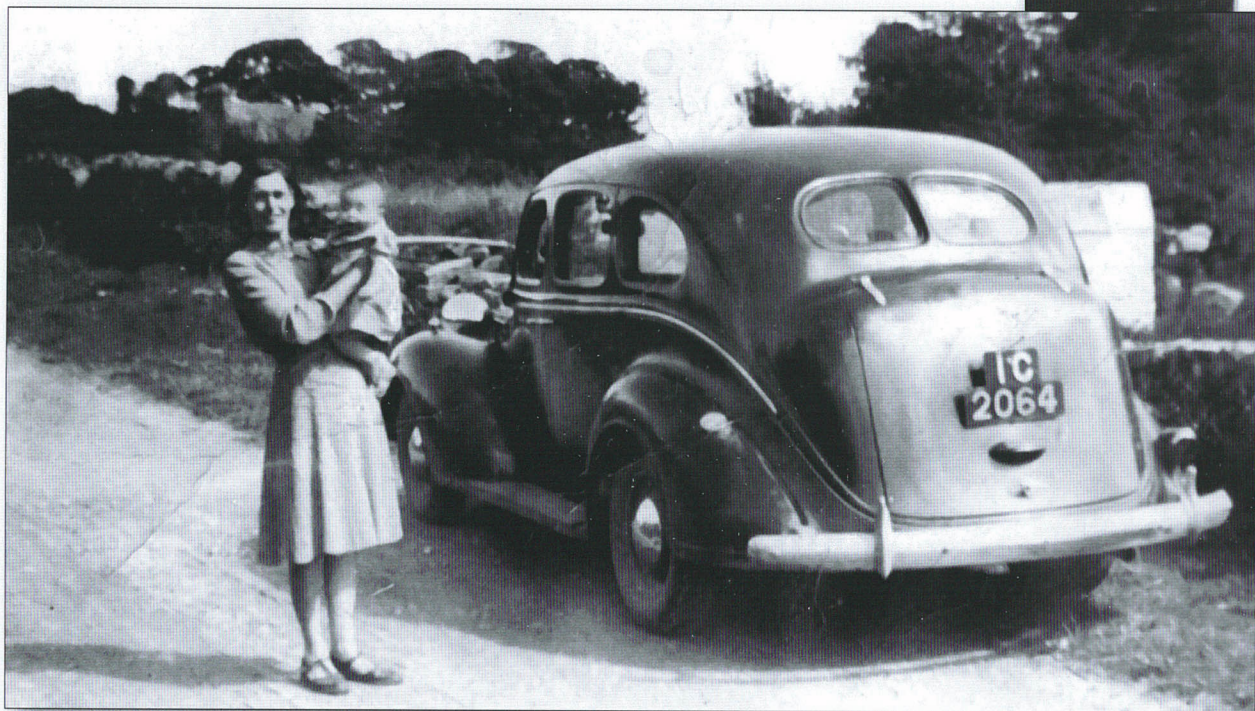

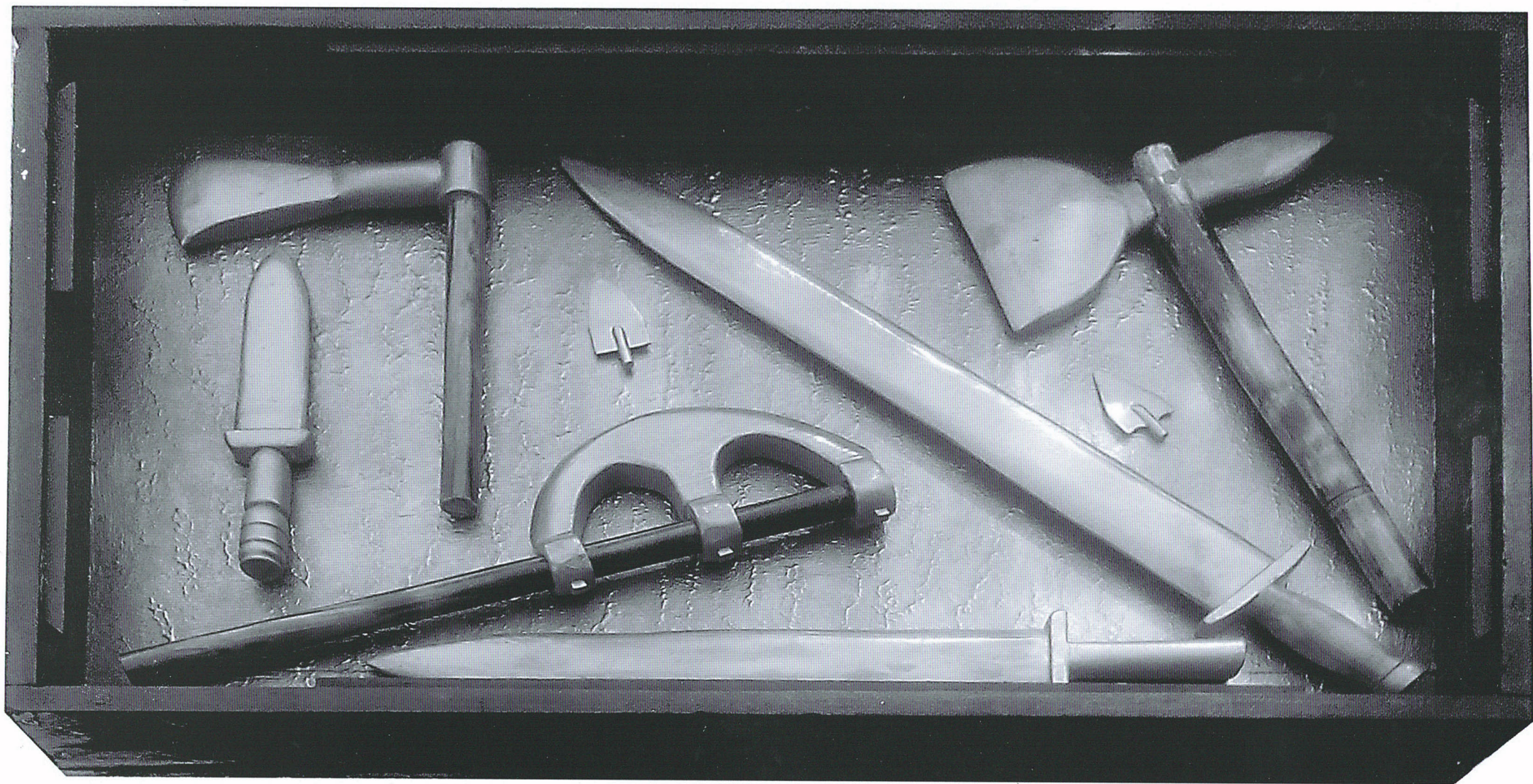

Neolithic Oughterard (4000 – 2500 BC)

During his research on the Neolithic Period (4000-2500 BC) in Oughterard, Bill Daly 'rediscovered' and cleaned up the 'Druid's Altar' monument which lies to the north of The Hatchery. This is a Wedge Tomb, over 5000 years old, and is a very impressive monument of the Neolithic.
