



**Circa 1950.** Oughterard From the air









The Bridge and Convent of Mercy (1857-2013) with the Catholic Church in the back ground. The Sisters of Mercy were invited to Oughterard by Rev. Fr. Kavanagh P.P. and replaced The Faithful Companions of Jesus (1843-1846). Four sisters took possession of a small house near the church which was provided rent free. Funds were scarce and classes were held in out offices but by 1863 there were 345 children on the school roll. The present Primary School building dates back to C 1888.
